## Objectives

### **Communications and Engagement Strategy**

Previous outreach and engagement with social sciences students has been less than acceptable. Though the MSU has been actively trying to increase its engagement efforts, there hasn't been consistency amongst the communication and engagement activities that are geared towards students. The Communications and Engagement strategy is being developed as a resource for SRA Social Sciences members to communicate and engage with their constituents on a consistent basis. Its aim is to create a protocol that caucus members can use to interact with the faculty and its members.

### **MSU 'How To' Elections Guide**

This guide will serve as a handy 'How To' for students looking to get involved. This resource is being created to assist students interested in becoming involved with the union and attempting to reduce the barriers that are present. We will be working with the Elections Department as well as other resources and services within the MSU to accomplish this platform point.

### **Formalized relationship with MSSS and Faculty of Social Sciences**

As already determined, we will sit regularly with the MSSS to ensure we are in a collaborative and supportive relationship that best benefits students from both MSU and faculty-level platforms. Likewise, ensuring that we communicate with the Faculty of Social Sciences will enable the best and most comprehensive support for Soc Sci students.

### **Student Representation at the University Level**

Based on previous student engagement, some folks in Social Sciences have felt mis- and under-represented at the University level. This review can be completed easily through survey and/or consultation, and will engage faculty and students to see how we can ensure that students' voices are adequately represented.

### **Accessibility for Courses/SAS Capabilities**

Podcasting courses is one step to improving accessibility for courses for students. Similarly, we would like to work with students and SAS to ensure that SAS is meeting the needs of students in the best way they can (e.g. adequately recognizing the difficulty and inaccessibility of requiring doctor's notes, and re-evaluating and reforming the current notetaking system).

### **Improved Course Evaluations**

The current course evaluations system is crucial to quality of education; we would like to ensure that the system is transparent in how it affects teaching and educational opportunities, and, if needed, that the system is improved. We will do so through consultation with the Provost, Faculty, and others involved, and then potentially through a survey/other feedback opportunity.

## Objectives

### L.R. Willson: Hours

Make the building designated for Social Science and Humanities students feel more like a second home with extended hours (ideally an hour before classes start and an hour after classes finish at night). Work with Stacey and lobby to the Dean of Social Sciences to do this.

### L.R. Willson: Lounge

This lounge is meant to be a home to Social Sciences students (and Humanities students!). We would like to work with the MSSS and the Faculty of Social Sciences to decorate and make this space accessible and comfortable for students to use to study, hang out, and feel at home at Mac.

### Experiential Opportunities

Continuing the work from the previous Social Sciences Caucus, we're looking to work with the Social Sciences Experiential Education (EE) centre to learn how we can better support them and our faculty in obtaining experiential opportunities.

### Optimizing Various Rooms for Studying Purposes

Currently, during exam and midterm season the only study rooms that can be used during exam/midterm season are either in the library or in LR-Wilson (where the rooms are only available to social science and humanities students). To deal with this issue, we plan to work closely with both administration and members of the MSU to optimize the current booking system. After the optimization of the current booking system, we will aim to set the system to allow students to be able to book rooms in KTH, TSH, and CNH among other buildings on campus. These bookings will be available during exam/midterm season and during the after-hours of the day. Along with that, we would like to collaborate with the IT department to create an app to allow students to book these rooms among other study rooms from the comfort of their phones.

### Healthier and Cheaper Food Options

After hearing several complaints from our constituents, we found that many of them are highly displeased with the rising food prices especially of entities such as Centro and Willy Dog. We plan to find the reasoning behind these rising prices and see where we can redistribute funds to provide cheaper and good quality food. Along with this, we hope to work closely with the VP of Finance, the administration, and members of the MSU to find a way to provide healthier and cheaper food options available on campus in areas such as Centro and La Piazza among others. This will also require a possible redistribution of funds along with maybe finding other food distributors to work with.

## Objectives

### **More Informal Events for Students**

Like the overall year plan, we would like to build and strengthen relations among faculty and students. We believe by doing this, students will be able to form a causal yet formal relationship with the faculty, with this new relationship students will be more likely to reach out to their Professors and TAs in times of academic need and possibly for other endeavours.

### **Reconstructing the Application Process for Welcome Week**

Currently, student testimonies depict welcome week to be based around the faculty/residence representatives. To circumvent this issue, we plan to work with the MSSS and examine how faculty representatives are being chosen every year. We aim to change the current applications that we have to eliminate a rep-focused environment during welcome week. Additionally, we plan to talk with the welcome week planners, once chosen, to make sure they are aware of the students issues as well as discuss ways to eliminate, to the best of their ability, any potential biases to make sure that welcome week is the best experience for the first years.

### **Mental Health Initiatives**

After speaking with constituents, I found that many of the mental health services are proven to be very helpful for students, but many do not take full advantage of these services. This is because many are not aware of the services we offer and the events that they put on. Additionally, many feel that they are not welcome in certain spaces. We aim to build upon existing relationships that we have with services such as SHEC, Maccess and other MSU services as well as work together in creating events and workshops based on mental health. This process also involves collaborating closely with the Clubs Coordinator for the MSSS to reach a wider group of students within our faculty.

### **Increase Turnout to Events and Build Relationship with MSSS**

I would like to build the relationship between the MSSS and SRA. There isn't as much communication as we would like there to be currently and we are in the process of going to their meetings and making sure all parties are up to date.

<p><b>Benefits</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Improving accessibility for students, and educational opportunities for all. Addresses concerns that students have had for years about different accessibility issues on campus.</li> </ul>
